 - a. <u>Who meets criteria?</u> People who are literally unsheltered homeless, living in a place not meant for habitation.
 - b. <u>What is the referral process and what regions are served?</u> Lafourche, Terrebonne, St John, St James, Assumption, St Bernard, Plaquemines
 - c. <u>Location?</u> 420 Magnolia St in Houma, LA or those in need can be met out in the community
 - d. <u>Program specifics.</u> Focus on diversion and intervention. Working in conjunction with the haven and other shelters to complete coordinated entries on participants

 - a. <u>Who meets criteria?</u> People who are literally unsheltered homeless, living in a place not meant for habitation.

- E. Network Process: Kristen Gentry
 - a. <u>Who meets criteria?</u> "Voucher program". Can complete a coordinated entry assessment and qualify for the CE assessment as well as Street Outreach. They can only have a Voucher if they choose to not be enrolled in CE or SO.
 - b. How often can this program assist and what regions are served? Once per calendar year, 2-3 night hotel vouchers or shelter (Bunkhouse). Terrebonne Region is served. Case by Case basis for Houma cases as well as other regions.
 - c. Location? 137 New Orleans Blvd. Houma, La
- F. Beautiful Beginning Shelter: Kelli Cunningham/ Kristen Gentry
 - a. Open rooms? 3 rooms open, 4 apps pending
 - b. <u>Is there a wait list? Not at this time</u>
 - c. <u>Main requirements to enter the shelter?</u> Required to work 30 hours/week to qualify for an income and transitional housing program. Need documentation such as Valid ID, SSC, work schedule if working. Children will need SSC, a shot record, proof of WIC or Health Insurance.
 - d. Location? Bond Street, Houma, La
- G. Transitional Living Program- Maegan Davis
 - a. <u>Open rooms?</u> 2 openings
 - b. Is there a wait list? Not at this time
 - c. <u>Main requirements to enter the shelter?</u> Ages 16-22 experiencing homelessness. Aging out of foster care. Currently 6 youth in the program. Have to do coordinated entry, can contact the street outreach program to be referred.
 - d. Location? West main st in Houma
- H. <u>Bunkhouse</u>: Bobbie O'Bryan
 - a. <u>Who meets Criteria?</u> Homeless. Working with local agencies and consolidated governments for referrals, some of those agencies provide voucher stays to the Bunkhouse. Have transitional rooms for people by themselves. Still providing meals from 5-530 pm. Averaging 30 meals per day.
 - b. <u>Location?</u> East side of Houma at the foot of the twinspan.
- I. TPCG: Kelli Cunngingham
 - a. Any updates with RRH? COC funded rapid rehousing: 13 vouchers, 1 person searching for housing, 1 person that didn't make contact.
 - b. Also have a voucher program that requires a SS card, valid ID, and coordinated entry to get a week voucher hotel stay.

 - a. <u>Who meets criteria? Must have activity served in a branch of the military.</u> (Singles, no family)
 - b. Additional Information? DD214 paperwork
 - c. <u>Where is it located?</u> 137 New Orleans Blvd and Grand Caillou Road
 - d. Program specifics- Low barrier Shelter, light case management.

- K. <u>GPD: Kristen Gentry</u>
 - a. <u>Who meets criteria? Must have activity served in a branch of the military.</u> (Singles, no family)
 - b. Additional information?DD214 paperwork
 - c. Where is it located? 137 New Orleans Blvd
 - d. <u>Program specifics</u> 24 months to gain employment, education, anything to get themselves on the right track while living in the shelter. Single people
- L. <u>SSVF</u>
 - a. Who meets criteria? Must have activity served in a branch of the military.
 - b. <u>Program specifics</u> Working with about 40 veterans. 5 referrals to assign. Everyone out of hotels and into the GPD program.
- M. Options for Independence:
 - a. <u>Any updates with RRH?</u> 100 vouchers for the program through Options for Independence.

 - a. Open discussion of SOAR Trainings- Debbie Triggs

Emergency and transitional housing for DOC: In 2021, has been able to pay for 9 at bunkhouse and 1 at start corporation.

New application for housing opportunities. DOC will pay for up to 6 months, will free up some vouchers for programs.
